Assessment type	DOPS on a real patient or within a simulation situation (1:1)
Assessor	Consultant, OR an Associate Specialist or Senior Specialty Doctor who meets the eligibility criteria to be an ACP Educational Supervisor as defined in the ACP Credentialing Regulations (please contact ACP@rcem.ac.uk to confirm eligibility)
Guidance	<p>Within this assessment, ACPs will be expected to provide evidence of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • how they respond to the physiological derangements caused by life-threatening haemorrhage • use of major haemorrhage protocol and associated treatments • definitive treatment, or referral for definitive treatment. <p>This can be evidenced from any condition.</p>
